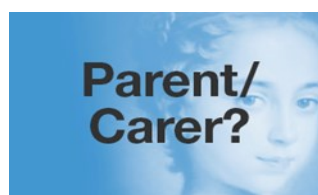
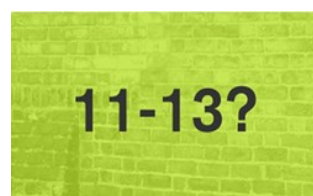
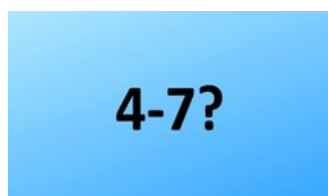

Early Help for Children and Families at St Oswald's CE Primary School and Nursery

Everyone needs help at some time in their lives and therefore an ethos of early help is important at St Oswald's. We believe that early interventions for children or families, in many cases, will prevent children from experiencing harm. St Oswald's will refer to appropriate agencies when help is required to support children, young people or families or to prevent harm. We also liaise with other agencies and people within the local community.
