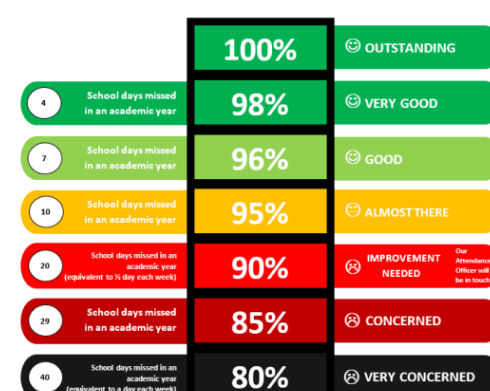

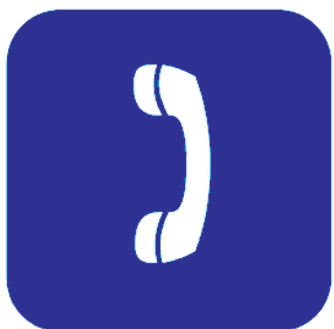

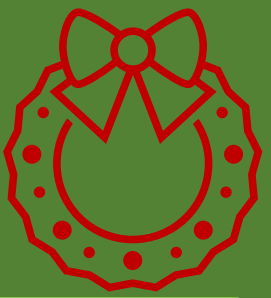
Goodbye & Good Luck!

Our Learning in Nursery

This month we have been focusing on Christmas. The children are preparing for their Christmas performance on Thursday and are very excited for their grown ups to come and watch. Since the beginning of the month we have been making Christmas cards, decorations and calendars and they will be sent home this week with the children.

Our nursery children have a fun week planned to end the term, we have different themed activities around our themed days. We have started the week with a nativity day and the children have made their own baby Jesus' in mangers (craft and cake form).

Next month, our topic is 'How I wonder what you are'. This is one of our favourite topics and is all about nursery rhymes. In Math time we will be focusing on the numbers and numerals of 3,4 and 5. In Phonics we will be continuing to learn and hear new sounds using our sound box, visuals and initial sound games.

Our Learning in Reception Class

This month we have been looking at shapes in maths. Circles and triangles, rectangles and squares. We have made them, drawn them, spotted them around school. How many can you find in your home? December is all about Christmas in Reception. We were so proud of the children in their Nativity play. They all danced their socks off. Well done Reception! In the classroom we have practised our writing with letters to Santa, labels of presents and cards for our friends. In PE we have completed our dance based on Superworm and have now been thinking about coordination and control in multiskills. At Forest School we have made bird feeders, leaf caterpillars and created a new music station.



Next month, we will be learning about our planet and how we can look after it. We will be continuing our number work, securing our knowledge of numbers 1 – 5 and beyond and also learning new sounds in phonics!

Our Learning in Year 1

This month we have worked very hard on our singing and acting to perform our Christmas nativity. We really hope you enjoyed watching us! In our writing lessons we have been working towards writing a poem. This has linked to our science work on our senses. In science we have enjoyed tasting sweets to find out that we need our sense of smell to taste. The children have just finished a maths unit on subtraction and have become very confident with this operation and with solving simple problems. In RE we have been learning about what it is like to be part of a Christian faith community. Thank you to Rayan's mum who told us about the Muslim faith community so we could compare. In art, we have been printing in different ways, inspired by Andy Warhol.



Next, we will be learning all about Australia! We will learn to locate it on a world map and find out about its physical and human features. Our writing will be inspired by the story 'Wombat goes Walkabout'. In maths, we will learn more efficient addition and subtraction strategies. In our science lessons we will begin to sort and classify animals, using the correct vocabulary such as mammal, carnivore, nocturnal.

Our Learning in Year 2

This month we have been learning about multiplication and division in our maths lessons. During literacy we have been writing our biographies about our chosen famous person – do ask your child who they wrote about! In history, we have started our topic about Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale. We have finished our dance topic in P.E. which the children thoroughly enjoyed. In guided reading we are finishing our class text – The Guard Dog - which the children have enjoyed reading and answering lots of questions about! In RE, we are finishing our topic – Why does Christmas matter to Christians? - thinking about why the birth of Jesus is so important to Christians.



Next month, we will be continuing our topic in history about famous women in history. In maths, we will move on to length and mass. In Science, we are continuing to investigate different materials and will be carrying out several investigations to find out which materials are waterproof and which are not and which materials you can squash, bend and stretch. In PE with Miss Hall, we will be continuing with our topic of gymnastics looking at how we can move in different directions, linking together different movements and then finally, performing these skills with a partner. In RE, we will be exploring the topic "Who is a Muslim and how do they live?".

Our Learning in Year 3

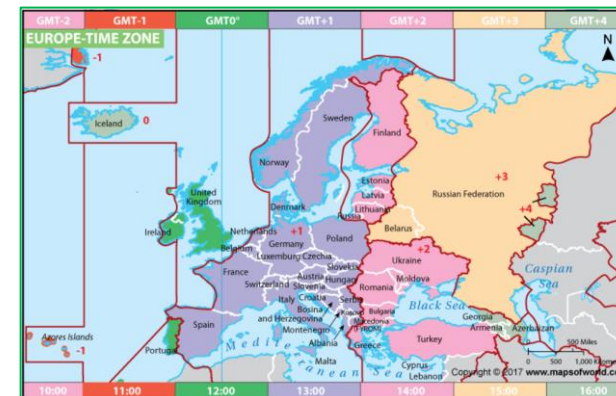
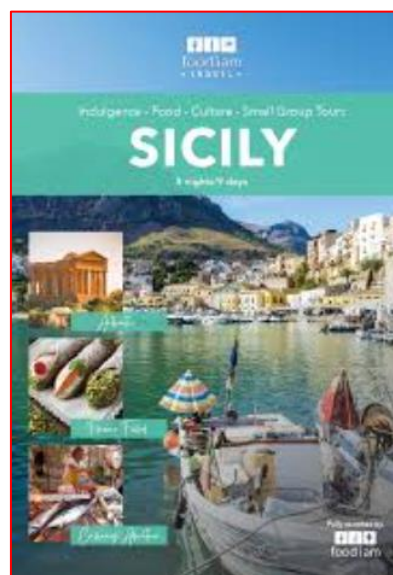
This month we have been developing our multiplication and division skills to be able to multiply and divide a 2-digit number with and without renaming. The children have then been able to use the taught methods to solve word problems linked to multiplication and division. In History, we have been focused on the Stone Age which has supported our English learning on Skara Brae. Within this writing unit, we have been looking at persuasive holiday brochures and writing our own. The children also enjoyed singing in the KS2 carol service and performing the Christmas songs they had learnt in ukelele lessons to some of the teachers.



Next month, we will be exploring length and mass in Maths and moving onto our new unit in writing 'The Three Little Pigs Twisted Fairy Tales'. In Guided Reading, the children will be reading 'The Iron Man' and in Geography, the unit will be focused on rivers, mountains and coasts.

Our Learning in Year 4

This month we have been developing our multiplication and division skills in Maths. In English we have been looking at persuasive writing. We looked at a brochure advertising Sicily and the children have just finished writing their own persuasive brochures! In history we have learnt about Europe and the children were shocked when we looked into time zones. The children have had a great time at forest school and have earned their knot tying badge.



Next month, we will be continuing with our multiplication and doing lots of MTC style practice on the computers. In History we will be starting our new topic the Egyptians! In guided reading we will start reading Secrets of a Sun King by Emma Carroll. After Christmas, the Year 4s will be going swimming every Monday so will need to make sure they have their swimming kits.

Our Learning in Year 5

This month has been very busy! It started with the Year 5 and 6 Cross Country tournament in Stourport, before we were flung into the Christmas excitement and festivities. We have rehearsed and then led two KS2 carol services for parents, made Christmas cards and put a festive twist on our DT sewing unit by making hanging felt tree decorations. In English we have written non chronological reports about rainforest animals of our choice and have finished reading 'The Silver Sword' in Guided Reading.

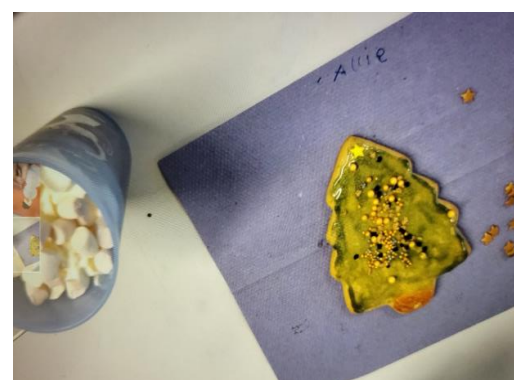
We were very lucky to have an impromptu performance of Christmas songs from our talented guitarists.



Next month, we will be applying our multiplication and division skills to fractions and decimals – it is so important that all children continue to practise their times tables as they are used in so many ways! We will begin new units in science (materials and their properties) and history (Early Islamic Civilisation). We will also complete our final rehearsals for Young Voices before the concert on Tuesday 13th January!

Our Learning in Year 6

This month we have been learning all about fractions in maths, including how to multiply and divide them. We have written stories based on A Monster Calls. In Guided Reading, we have finished Harry Potter! In geography, we completed our topic all about freshwater biomes and in science we finished our electricity topic. We have also painted colourful self-portraits in art and learnt about notes in music. We have also enjoyed our final Christmas in primary school by making Christmas cards, Christmas decorations and singing in the KS2 Christmas Service.



After Christmas, we will be moving on to decimals, measurements, percentages and ratio in maths. In English, we will have a non-fiction focus for our writing, inspired by David Attenborough and Greta Thunberg. In science, we will focus on evolution and inheritance. Our history topic will be The Victorians. We will find out all about the royal family and society at the time. Our PE days will be Tuesday and Thursday.



Sports News



On Friday 3rd December, children from Years 5 and 6 took part in the Wyre Forest Cross Country competition. They had to complete a very muddy course around Stourport Memorial Park – about 1500m for the Year 5 race and 1800m for the Year 6 race. All the children showed lots of school and sporting values including perseverance and resilience. It was also fantastic to hear the children who were not in a particular race cheering on their friends.

Well done to the children in Year 5 who took part in the longer race against Year 6 children – it will be good practice for next year!

Congratulations to Payton and Logan, who were both in the top 25 of their races. A particular well done to Cleo, who did amazingly well and came 8th out of over 100 participants in the Year 5 girls race! She has been selected as a reserve runner for the county finals.

Each child contributed to our school total, helping us to come 5th overall in the small schools competition.

A huge thank you to Miss Withams, Mrs Calcutt and Mrs Broadhead for braving the cold to take the children – without the support of staff the children would not be able to enjoy these sporting events. And thank you to Miss Withams for washing all the muddy kits afterwards!

Protecting Our Children



Protecting Our Children on the School Run

Every parent wants the same thing - for their child to arrive at school safely. But the school run is one of the most dangerous moments in a child's day. Even small changes in how we drive and park can make a huge difference.

The Reality: Children Are at Risk Near Schools

Recent UK road safety data shows thousands of children are hurt on our roads every year. When we look specifically at the area around schools, the picture becomes even more alarming.

Using national collision data and school-location research (STATS19), the numbers over the last 5 years are horrifying:

2,150 children aged 0-11 were killed or injured within just 100 metres of a school

...in the very place where they should feel safe.

Why It Happens

Most incidents near schools involve:

- Cars mounting pavements or reversing without full visibility
- Children stepping out between parked cars
- Congestion caused by unsafe or rushed parking
- Speeding in 20mph zones
- Double-parking or stopping on double-yellow and zig-zag lines, blocking sightlines



What Parents Can Do - Small Actions, Big Impact

You can dramatically reduce risk with a few simple habit changes ...

Park a little further away - Park along Sion Avenue and walk with your child

Slow right down - Children are unpredictable. Drive at 20mph instead of 30mph

Never stop on the double-yellow or zig-zag lines - They're there to protect visibility and safe spaces

Stay distraction-free - No phones, no quick texts, no glancing at notifications

Avoid U-turns and reversing near the gates - These are involved in a large number of school collisions

A Shared Responsibility

Every parent is busy with some needing to get to other schools, or work, or appointments etc. **However, the safety of all children - not just our own - depends on the choices we make behind the wheel.**

If every driver takes a little more time and care, slows down a little; and parks with more thought, we can dramatically reduce the number of children hurt on the school run.

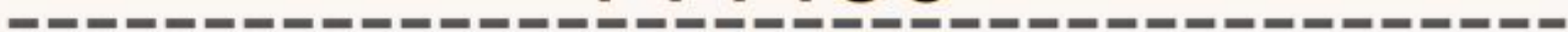

Wraparound Care Provisions

Wraparound care provisions is a fun, nurturing environment with a range of enrichment activities tailored to the needs of the children. The children have the choice of free play which builds lovely new friendships. We offer toys, games, technology, relaxation, reading, role-play, outside play (weather permitting) and lots of seasonal arts and craft activities for your young person to enjoy.



Breakfast Club

We open our doors at 7.40am and charge £4.30 per session. You can drop at any time between 7.40 and 8.30am. Children can have a healthy breakfast of cereal, toast, bagel, fresh fruit and squash, making them ready for the school day ahead. Cut off for booking sessions will be 12 midday the day before.



After School Club

We close our doors at 5.30pm and charge £4.60 if collected by 4.30pm or £8.20 if collected by 5.30pm. You can collect any time between 3.30pm and 5.30pm, by ringing the bell at the side entrance to the back playground or by calling our wraparound mobile phone number 07507565364. Light healthy snacks are also provided in after school club. Cut off for booking sessions will be 12 midday for after school club on the same day.

Booking and Cancelling Wraparound for All Children - Nursery to Year 6

All wraparound sessions are booked via Arbor, our parent portal (unless your child is of nursery age): <https://st-oswalds-primary-school.uk.arbor.sc/?/home-ui/index> – you will find wraparound services under clubs and payment is due at the time of booking also through Arbor. If for any reason you need to cancel the session, you can do this on Arbor by cancelling before the days cut off time of 12 midday for After School Club the same day and Breakfast Club for the following day. This will give you a full refund.

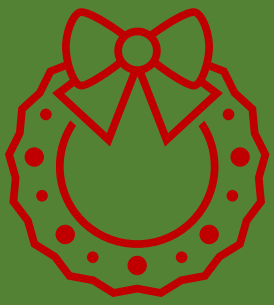
Universal Credit and Nursery Funded Hours

We are more than happy to supply a letter of evidence of your child's attendance at wraparound. Our school's URN number is 144456, should you need to provide this. We can also accept funded nursery hours as childcare providers, should you need a little extra time before or after nursery hours. Please contact us on office@stoswalds.worcs.sch.uk should you need assistance. For more information please take a look at the Government website to assist with funding childcare up to 11 years old: <https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare>

Late School Pick Up: If your child is still on school premises at 3.25pm, they will be taken across to after school club, where an admin charge of £4 will be added to the usual ASC charges.

Late Collection Fee: If your child is not collected by 5.30pm, when ASC closes, this is charged at £5.10 for every 5 minutes after. If you have booked for a 4.30pm collection and arrive after this time, you will be charged the 5.30pm cost (an additional £3.60) plus the admin fee of £4.

Unattended Booked Sessions (eg due to illness) will still be charged unless 24 hours notice has been given of the cancellation. This should be done via the Arbor app.

- Jewellery should not be worn except for stud earrings or a watch.

Make up and Jewellery

- Make up must not be worn to school at all by children, this includes nail varnish or false nails.
- Jewellery must not be worn except for stud earrings or a watch. These must be removed for PE.
- As a Health and Safety measure, hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back from the face at all times. No extreme hair styles or colours are permissible.
- Please remove earrings for your child before they come to school, on PE days if they are unable to do this for themselves

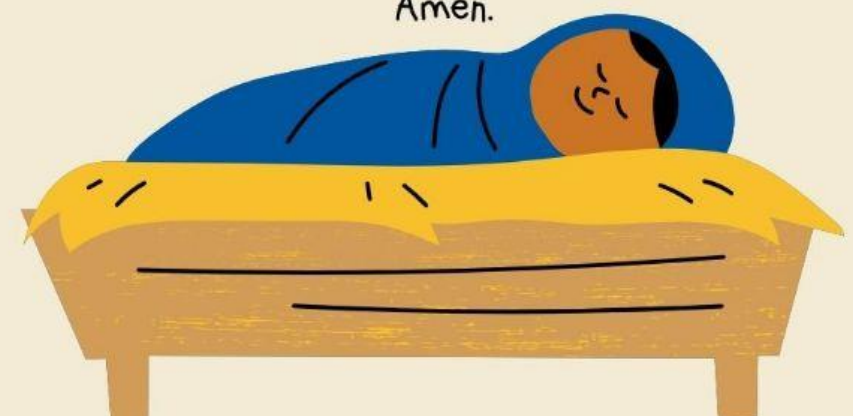

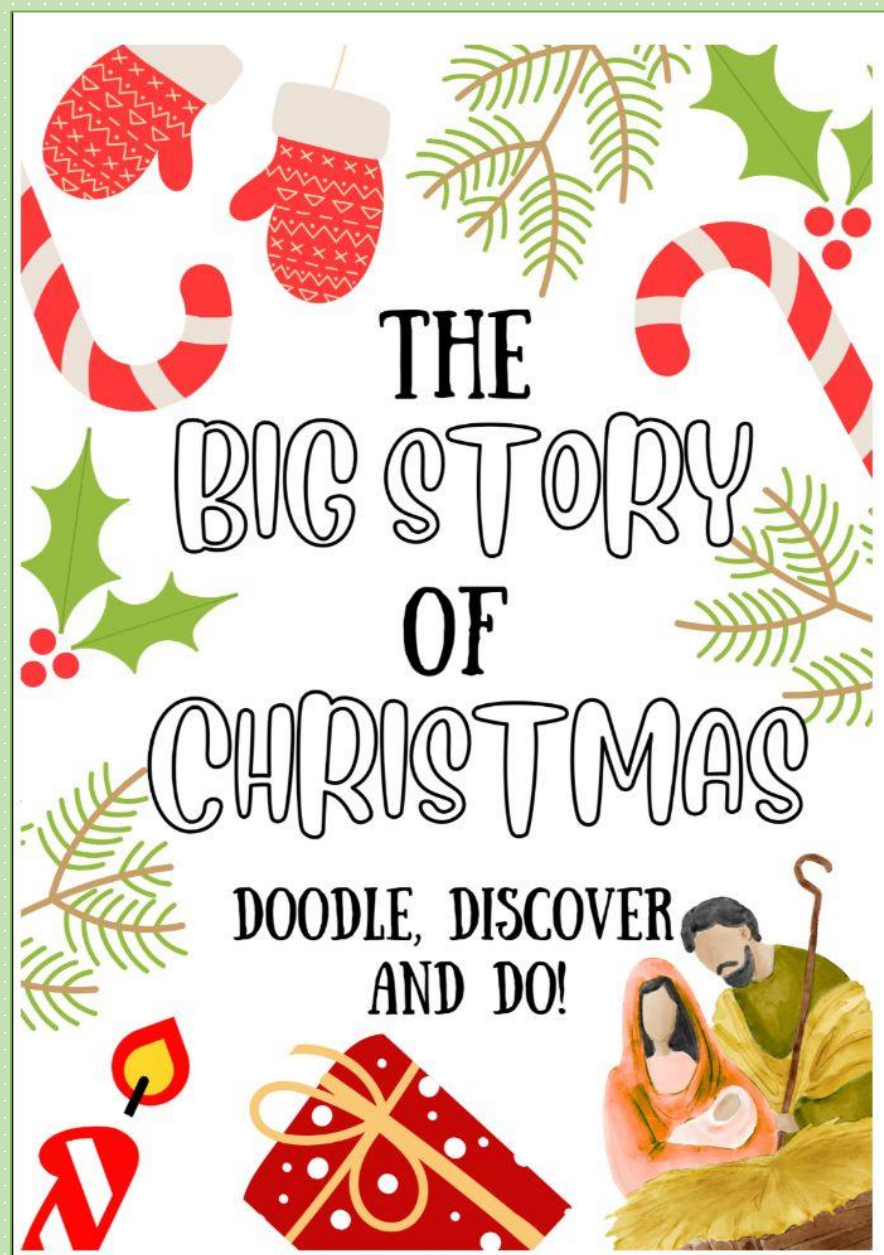
