- sustaining excellence by continuing to focus on disadvantaged pupils

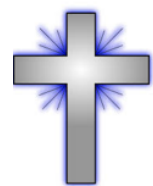

Think what a difference you can make to everyone around you just by being respectful. Make a special effort to be respectful at school and at home.

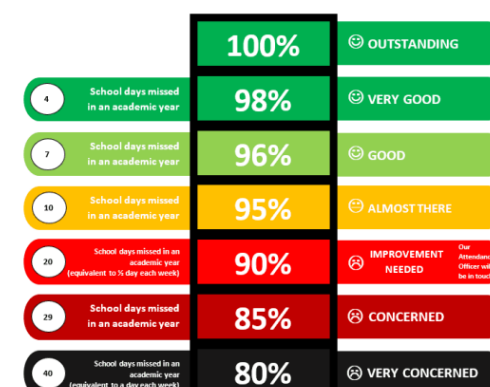

Inspire Embrace Succeed

Our Learning in Nursery

This month we have started off our new term with a new topic. This topic focuses on nursery rhymes, so far, we have sung and planned activities for 'Row your boat', 'I can sing a rainbow' and 'Look, there's a dinosaur'.

The children have enjoyed being outside in the colder weather and have explored in the ice and snow. In P.E this month we are focusing on our gross motor skills and coordination. The children have been practising their throwing and kicking so far.

In Maths time, we are learning all about the number 3 and number 4. This includes subitising, counting, numeral recognition and introducing a triangle, square and rectangle.

Our phonics sounds have been D, G, O and C.

We are also now having lots of interest in our nursery for the next school year. If your child has a sibling and you would like them to attend our nursery, please stop by after school pick up and we can go through our sessions. Children can start in Nursery from 2 years 9 months (limited spaces available for this age range).



Next month, we will be continuing with the same topic as well as having a whole week to make valentines crafts and surprises to take home before we break up for half term.

Our Learning in Reception Class

We have started 2026 off looking at stories with a repetitive nature. 'On the way home' has ignited the children's imagination and they have all had a good go at retelling the story or creating their own versions of why Claire hurt her knee. We have also been familiarising ourselves with the story of the gingerbread man and thinking about goodies and baddies in stories we know and love. In maths we are continuing our learning on numbers from 1-5 and beyond, practising being able to see numbers in small groups (I can see 3 and 2 more...5) We have also been exploring the days of the week, patterns and 3D shapes. We have also enjoyed taking our learning outside, especially in the snow!



Next month, we will be continuing to learn new phonics sounds, explore more 'once upon a time' stories and begin to think about measurements.

Our Learning in Year 1

The wintery weather this month provided the perfect opportunity for noticing seasonal change – a recurring theme in our science learning. We have looked closely at the signs of winter in our environment and compared this with what we observed in autumn. We also had fun in the snow! Our learning focus in geography is Australia. We have used an atlas to find out which continent Australia is in and which oceans it is between. In our writing lessons we are using 'Wombat Goes Walkabout' to develop our sentence writing and use more ambitious vocabulary. In maths, we are beginning a unit on addition and calculation strategies, focussing on finding more efficient ways to add and subtract numbers to 20.



Next month, we will find out more about Australia, including its physical and human features. We will look at the city of Sydney. In our science lessons, we will sort and classify animals, using scientific language such as carnivore, mammal, nocturnal. We will produce a piece of extended story writing featuring some of the Australian animals we have learned about.

Our Learning in Year 2

This month we have been learning about length in maths and applying it to everyday scenarios. In writing, we have been reading "The Crow's Tale" and so far have written a setting description about a valley in the winter. Our topic of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole has continued, and the children have been researching about the conditions soldiers faced in hospitals during that time. In science, we have been investigating how the shapes of solid objects can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.



Next month, we will be planning our narrative based on "The Crow's Tale" and the children will be focussing on using adjectives to add detail. In maths, we will be moving onto mass and applying the knowledge learnt to word problems. In guided reading, we will continue to read the book, "The Rainbow Bear" and answer questions about the text. In PE, we will continue our gymnastic unit developing the skills of high and low parts of the body when doing floorwork and when using the apparatus.

Inspire Embrace Succeed

Our Learning in Year 3

This month we have started our new unit in English based around the book 'The True Story of the 3 Little Pigs!' that explores the traditional tale from the perspective of a wolf with a cold. The children have been inspired by the text to write a diary entry as the wolf. In Maths, we have started our measurement units and looked at both length and mass. In Geography, we have been exploring rivers, being able to label them and identify rivers within the UK. In Science we have been learning about rocks and in RE we have been learning about Islam.

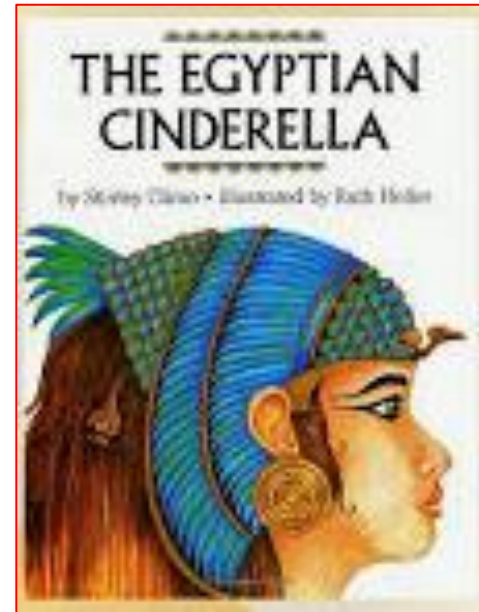


Next month, we will be continuing our unit in English, and the children will be planning and writing their own alternative fairy tales. In Maths, we will be finishing our unit on mass and start exploring volume. In Geography, we will be continuing our unit with more of a focus on mountains and coasts.

Our Learning in Year 4

This month we have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians in history. We have looked at Howard Carter and linked our history with our guided reading as we are reading Secrets of a Sun King by Emma Carroll. To help inspire our writing, we have started reading The Egyptian Cinderella.

This month saw the start of our swimming sessions. In maths we have been looking at long multiplication using the expanded column method and short division. The children have all been fantastic and making improvements each week.

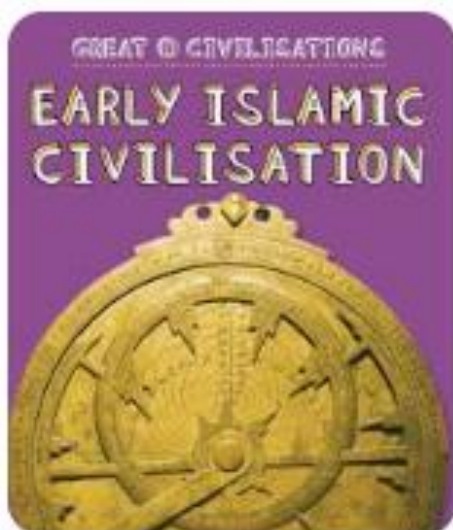

Next month, we will be learning more about the Egyptians, looking into mummification! In science we will be looking at some experiments to do with our unit of states of matter.

We will continue looking at the Secrets of a Sun King and The Egyptian Cinderella.

Our Learning in Year 5

This month we have been writing speeches about a social issue, such as homelessness. We have then performed these speeches to our friends, thinking about our expression and intonation to make them interesting to listen to. In maths we have read and interpreted line graphs as well as starting our fractions unit, building on what we learnt in Year 4. We have started learning about the Early Islamic Civilisation in History – whilst the Anglo Saxons in Britain were fighting for land and power, in Baghdad they were gaining all the knowledge they could!

Next month, we will continue to create a 'rubbish dance' in PE – we are thinking about different ways that we can move to show different materials being recycled. In Science we will continue with our 'properties of materials' topic, focussing on how different materials act in different scenarios and how that makes them useful for making different products. In English we will use the short film 'The Present' as our stimulus for writing.

Our Learning in Year 6

This month, we have been learning about David Attenborough in English and wrote biographies about him. We will soon move on to learning about Greta Thunberg and writing persuasive speeches inspired by her. In maths, we have been learning about decimals, including how to multiply and divide them. In history we have started our topic on the Victorians and found out about the significant events that took place during this era and what Victorian society was like. In science we have been learning about evolution and in RE we have been learning about Hinduism.



Next month, we will finish our topics on Victorians, evolution and Hinduism and complete Key Assessment tasks to demonstrate our learning. In maths, we will move on to learning about percentages. In art, we will learn about William Morris, particularly his wallpaper designs, before designing our own patterns inspired by nature.

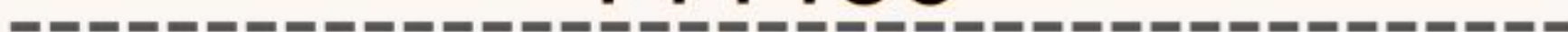

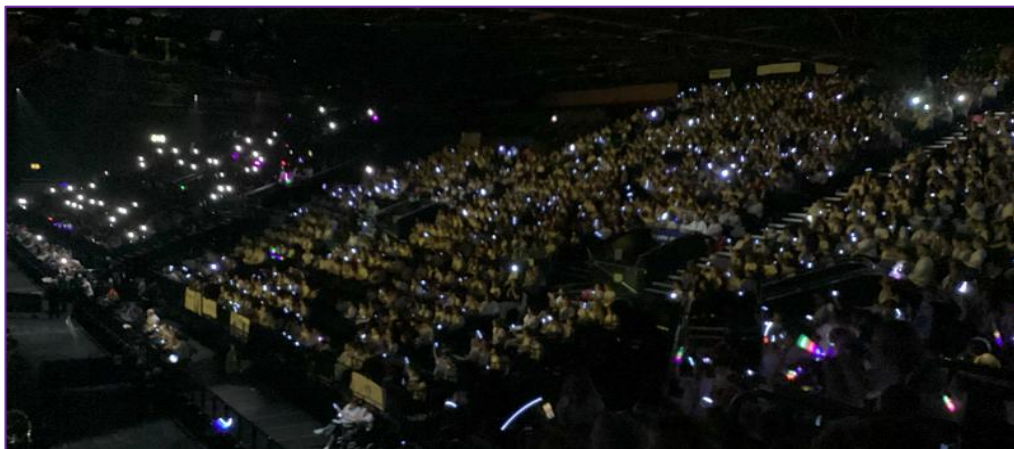

Snow day...at school!

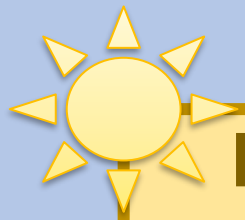

Wraparound Care Provisions

Wraparound care provisions is a fun, nurturing environment with a range of enrichment activities tailored to the needs of the children. The children have the choice of free play which builds lovely new friendships. We offer toys, games, technology, relaxation, reading, role-play, outside play (weather permitting) and lots of seasonal arts and craft activities for your young person to enjoy.



Breakfast Club

We open our doors at 7.40am and charge £4.30 per session. You can drop at any time between 7.40 and 8.30am. Children can have a healthy breakfast of cereal, toast, bagel, fresh fruit and squash, making them ready for the school day ahead. Cut off for booking sessions will be 12 midday the day before.



After School Club

We close our doors at 5.30pm and charge £4.60 if collected by 4.30pm or £8.20 if collected by 5.30pm. You can collect any time between 3.30pm and 5.30pm, by ringing the bell at the side entrance to the back playground or by calling our wraparound mobile phone number 07507565364. Light healthy snacks are also provided in after school club. Cut off for booking sessions will be 12 midday for after school club on the same day.

Booking and Cancelling Wraparound for All Children - Nursery to Year 6

All wraparound sessions are booked via Arbor, our parent portal: <https://st-oswalds-primary-school.uk.arbor.sc/?/home-ui/index> – you will find wraparound services under clubs and payment is due at the time of booking also through Arbor. If for any reason you need to cancel the session, you can do this on Arbor by cancelling before the days cut off time of 12 midday for After School Club the same day and Breakfast Club for the following day. This will give you a full refund.

Universal Credit and Nursery Funded Hours

We are more than happy to supply a letter of evidence of your child's attendance at wraparound. Our school's URN number is 144456, should you need to provide this. Funded hours for Nursery can also be used on wraparound care. Please contact us on office@stoswalds.worcs.sch.uk should you need assistance. For more information please take a look at the Government website to assist with funding childcare up to 11 years old: <https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare>

Late School Pick Up: If your child is still on school premises at 3.25pm, they will be taken across to after school club, where an admin charge of £4 will be added to the usual ASC charges.

Late Collection Fee: If your child is not collected by 5.30pm, when ASC closes, this is charged at £5.10 for every 5 minutes after. If you have booked for a 4.30pm collection and arrive after this time, you will be charged the 5.30pm cost (an additional £3.60) plus the admin fee of £4.

Unattended Booked Sessions (eg due to illness) will still be charged unless 24 hours notice has been given of the cancellation. This should be done via the Arbor app.

Make up and Jewellery

- Make up must not be worn to school at all by children, this includes nail varnish or false nails.
- Jewellery must not be worn except for stud earrings or a watch. These must be removed for PE.
- As a Health and Safety measure, hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back from the face at all times. No extreme hair styles or colours are permissible.
- Please remove earrings for your child before they come to school on PE days if they are unable to do this for themselves
