Message from the Headteacher, Mr A Hackley

Dear Parents and Carers,

As you are aware we had our OFSTED inspection on 8th 9th June. We are very pleased with the outcome, to be graded at 'Strong standard' in 6 areas is a very positive outcome. The report itself is available on the OFSTED website [St Oswald's CofE Primary School - Open - Find an Inspection Report - Ofsted](#). We are pleased that it mentions super outcomes for the children and praises the behaviour of children around school. Our only 'Expected' area was Attendance and Behaviour and this was due to our attendance figures which are significantly lower than our 96% target.

Thank you to everyone that spoke to the inspectors or filled in the Parentview questionnaire.

As we approach the end of term, it seems busier than ever with Sports Days, school trips, transition days and even the World Cup to add to the excitement! The recent heatwave also created challenges at school – we provided fans in the classroom, changed lessons and activities to make them less active and ensured the children drank lots of water and were in the shade at breaktimes. Our attendance was very low for those three days and, unfortunately, unless school is contacted and we are told a child is unwell or suffering from the heat due to a medical condition we still have to record the absence as unauthorised.

Many thanks for your continued support and I look forward to seeing some of you at the end of term events.

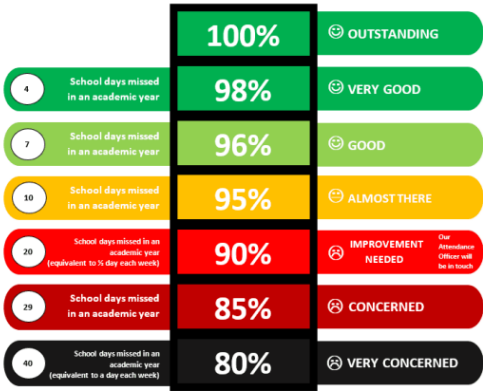

Our Learning in Nursery

This term we have started our new topic 'I wonder where I have been'. We started the topic with beach jars and sandcastle making. The children all had their own beach jar to make and take home, it included sand, water and fish. The children loved talking to us about their beach experiences and what they would expect to see at the beach. This month, the children have also enjoyed the story of Oliver's fruit salad. The children made their own healthy shopping lists which included fruit that Oliver has in his fruit salad. We discussed the supermarkets that the children had visited and what fruit they had seen. I used the shopping lists that the children had made to take with me to the supermarket and bought lots of fruit for us to cut and eat in a fruit salad like in Oliver's fruit Salad.

Our inspirational person for this term is Leo Messi. The children have learnt about where Messi is from and how he has been playing football since he was 4 years old. We have started to learn about the Fifa World Cup and have watched some videos of Messi scoring goals for his team.



Next month, we will be continuing our learning on where we have been and have a busy end of term with lots of different events including a trip to the park, a graduation and a fun week to finish!

Our Learning in Reception Class

This term we have introduced our new topic all about the weather! The children have enjoyed observing all of the different types of weather we experience in a week at school and talked about the hot weather we had during the holidays. We have been measuring how much rain we have each day by collecting the rainwater in a tub and measuring it using our cubes. In maths we are looking at how 10 is made and exploring patterns. I wonder what patterns you can find on your way to school? In PE we are playing lots of different games and learning to use our space safely, travelling and stopping at appropriate times. We will soon be practising for sports day!



Next month, we will be continuing our learning about the weather and delving into different types of weather in different places. We will be deepening our understanding of numbers to 10 and continuing to enjoy the fruits of our labour in our Reception garden and our Forest School garden.

Our Learning in Year 1

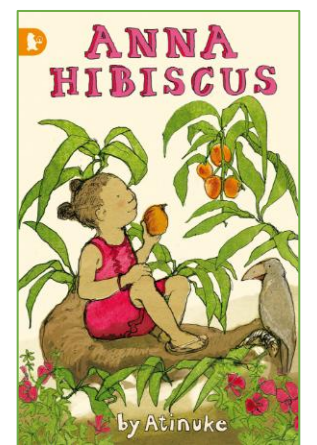
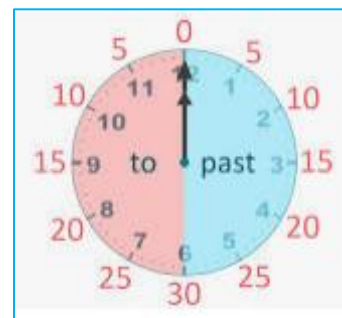
This month, Year 1 have been starting to learn all about World War 1. We have used maps and atlases to locate some of the countries that were involved and we have learned some of the vocabulary we will need to talk about why it started such as 'treaty' and 'invade'. The children have been producing some lovely sentences in our writing lessons based on the book 'Grandad's Island'. They have used some ambitious language to describe the island. In maths, we have covered multiplication and division, using apparatus to make and describe equal groups. In science we have been learning about the properties of different materials and sorting objects based on these properties. We have learnt new words like absorbent, transparent and opaque.



Next month, we will be learning why World War 1 started and we will use historical sources to find out what conditions were like in the trenches. In our writing lessons we will create a new adventure for Syd and Grandad and use the describing skills we have learned to write a new story for them. In maths, we will learn about fractions and divide groups of objects and shapes into halves and quarters. We will continue to investigate materials in science and learn how to carry out simple tests.

Our Learning in Year 2

This month in maths, we have been learning all about time, particularly telling and writing the time to 5 minutes. The children have really persevered with this as time can be tricky. In English, the crayons surprised the children by sending them a letter! They have now been working hard to include key skills in their writing ready to write a letter back to the crayons. In RE, we have been exploring what makes certain places sacred and special to believers as well as themselves. In Art, we have been exploring mixing primary colours to find out what secondary colours are created and creating colour wheels in preparation for our L.S Lowry art-work. Finally, in history we are nearing the end of our Antarctica topic and the children have enjoyed learning about the explorer Ernest Shackleton.

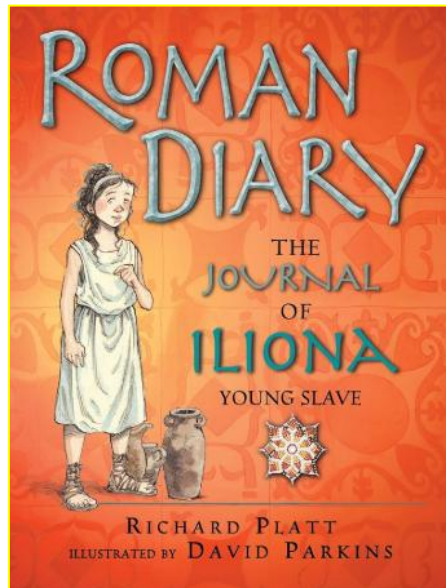
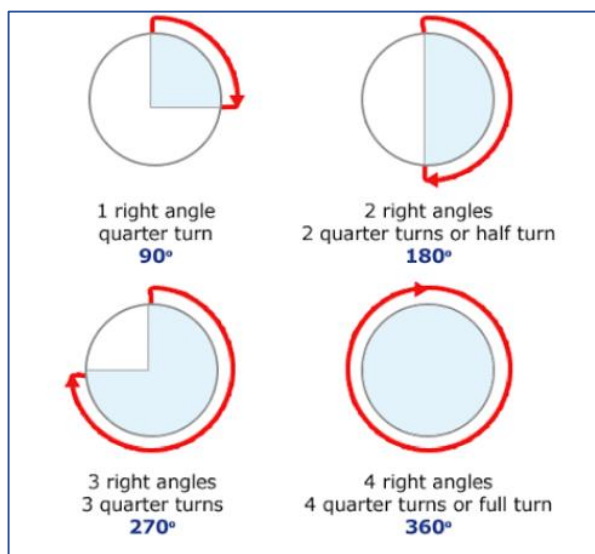


Next month, in maths, we will be learning all about volume, particularly focusing on comparing, measuring in litres and millilitres as well as problem solving. In PE we would have just completed our sports day, which the children are really looking forward to, and will be focusing on skills associated with Athletics. In guided reading, we will continue reading our text, 'Anna Hibiscus' and developing our reading skills such as sequencing events and retrieval and inference. In English, we will be moving on to our final text, 'The Building Boy' where the children will be writing their own narrative. In geography, we will begin learning about our local area.

Our Learning in Year 3

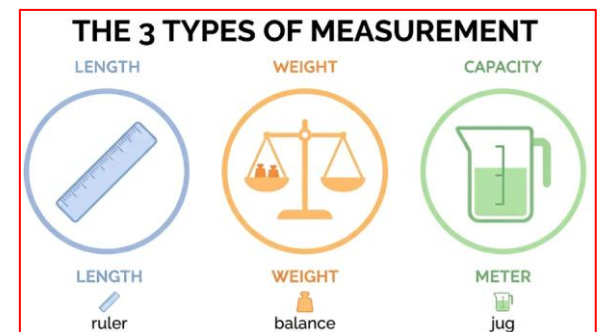
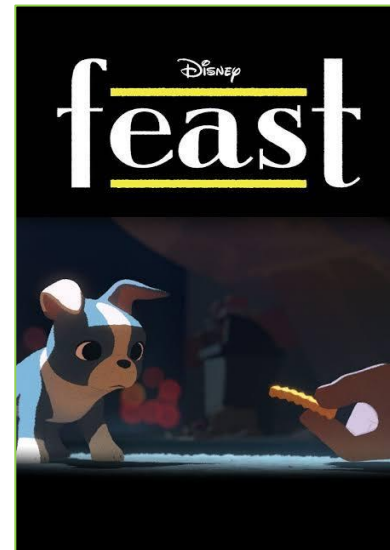
This month we have been learning about angles and turns in Maths understanding the different types of angles and comparing them. We have also been looking at lines and shapes, exploring the different types of lines (parallel, perpendicular, horizontal and vertical) and the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. In English, we have been focusing on our new text 'The journey of Iliona' and in science we have been exploring the different types of nutrients and why these are important for us to have.



Next month, we will be developing an understanding for perimeter in Maths and writing a diary entry in English as if we were watching a Gladiator battle. In PE we will be continuing to prepare for Sports Day and in History, we will be continuing to explore the Roman Empire in Britain. In Science we will be exploring different types of skeletons and why these are important.

Our Learning in Year 4

This month we have been learning about Length, Mass and Volume in our Maths lessons. The children have been brilliant at converting between units of measurement and ordering volumes of containers. In English, we have looked at a short film called "Feast." Using this as inspiration, we've written wonderful narratives about finding a stray pet and their enjoyment of different foods. In Geography, we have looked at the impact of tsunamis.



Next month, we will be learning about types of angles and how to spot symmetry in Geometry. In English, we will be reading Arthur and the Golden Rope and using this as a basis for our writing. We will continue to look at vocabulary for classroom items in Spanish and in RE, we will discuss the impact of Pentecost on the disciples.

Our Learning in Year 5

This month we have been writing a transmission to send to Mission Control from different planets or places on Earth that we have been stranded on! We've enjoyed changing our tone to make it more information and considering what we might need to do to survive on an inhospitable planet. In maths we have converted different units of measure and built on our learning from Year 4 about perimeter and area. We have completed our final assessments for the year for reading and maths. In PSHE we took part in a first aid workshop – see the photos below!



Next month, we will be participating in Sports Day, contributing to our team scores. We will continue to learning about the stages of the human lifecycle and the body changes that happen as we get older. We will also enjoy the last few weeks of the school year and the countdown to our final year at St Oswald's!

Our Learning in Year 6

This month we have been writing so much there has been steam coming out of our pens! This is in preparation for our end of year writing assessments. We have edited pieces from earlier in the year and written a police report based on the animation 'Road's End'. We have also used the book 'The Eye of the Wolf' in Guided Reading and started our topics about 'Living Things and Their Habitats' in science as well as 'What Religions Say When Life Gets Hard' in RE. As well as all of this, we have also begun rehearsals for our end of year play: 'Grimm – Once Upon A Musical'!



Next month, we will be preparing to end our time at primary school by planning our Leavers' Service. We will also work towards performing our play. This will involve creating props, a programme, tickets and scenery! Of course, we will be fresh from our two-night residential at The Pioneer Centre, where the children will have made lots of amazing memories together. We will experience our last Sports Day, our last Forest School sessions and our last days at St Oswald's... Get the tissues ready!

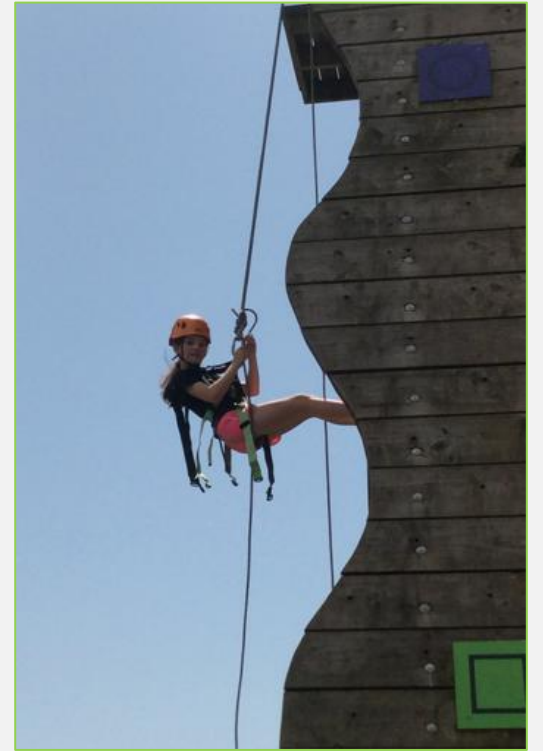
Year 4 and 5 Outdoor Day

Wraparound Care Provisions

Wraparound care provisions is a fun, nurturing environment with a range of enrichment activities tailored to the needs of the children. The children have the choice of free play which builds lovely new friendships. We offer toys, games, technology, relaxation, reading, role-play, outside play (weather permitting) and lots of seasonal arts and craft activities for your young person to enjoy.



Breakfast Club

We open our doors at 7.40am and charge £4.30 per session. You can drop at any time between 7.40 and 8.30am. Children can have a healthy breakfast of cereal, toast, bagel, fresh fruit and squash, making them ready for the school day ahead. Cut off for booking sessions will be 12 midday the day before.



After School Club

We close our doors at 5.30pm and charge £4.60 if collected by 4.30pm or £8.20 if collected by 5.30pm. You can collect any time between 3.30pm and 5.30pm, by ringing the bell at the side entrance to the back playground or by calling our wraparound mobile phone number 07507565364. Light healthy snacks are also provided in after school club. Cut off for booking sessions will be 12 midday for after school club on the same day.

Booking and Cancelling Wraparound for All Children - Nursery to Year 6

All wraparound sessions are booked via Arbor, our parent portal (unless your child is of nursery age): <https://st-oswalds-primary-school.uk.arbor.sc/?/home-ui/index> – you will find wraparound services under clubs and payment is due at the time of booking also through Arbor. If for any reason you need to cancel the session, you can do this on Arbor by cancelling before the days cut off time of 12 midday for After School Club the same day and Breakfast Club for the following day. This will give you a full refund.

Universal Credit and Nursery Funded Hours

We are more than happy to supply a letter of evidence of your child's attendance at wraparound. Our school's URN number is 144456, should you need to provide this. We can also accept funded nursery hours as childcare providers, should you need a little extra time before or after nursery hours. Please contact us on office@stoswalds.worcs.sch.uk should you need assistance. For more information please take a look at the Government website to assist with funding childcare up to 11 years old: <https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare>

Late School Pick Up: If your child is still on school premises at 3.25pm, they will be taken across to after school club, where an admin charge of £4 will be added to the usual ASC charges.

Late Collection Fee: If your child is not collected by 5.30pm, when ASC closes, this is charged at £5.10 for every 5 minutes after. If you have booked for a 4.30pm collection and arrive after this time, you will be charged the 5.30pm cost (an additional £3.60) plus the admin fee of £4.

Unattended Booked Sessions (eg due to illness) will still be charged unless 24 hours notice has been given of the cancellation. This should be done via the Arbor app.

Make up and Jewellery

- Make up must not be worn to school at all by children, this includes nail varnish or false nails.
- Jewellery must not be worn except for stud earrings or a watch. These must be removed for PE.
- As a Health and Safety measure, hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back from the face at all times. No extreme hair styles or colours are permissible.
- Please remove earrings for your child before they come to school, on PE days if they are unable to do this for themselves
