Wishing you all a restful and happy summer.

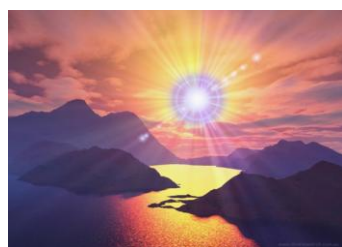

Our Learning in Nursery

This month has been very busy in nursery. The children have enjoyed going on a trip to the park. They fed the ducks, played and enjoyed having an ice cream. We also had a very emotional graduation for our nursery leavers, and this week to end the summer term we are having a fun week. The children have taken all the above in their stride.



Looking ahead to the autumn term, we will be welcoming lots of new nursery children and starting our new topic 'I wonder who I am?'.

Our Learning in Reception Class

This month we have been learning all about growing. Children were surprised that a beanstalk had mysteriously grown in our classroom and speculated that it probably sprouted through magic beans! We decided to grow our own beanstalks and learnt what they needed to grow healthily. We were not sure what would happen if a bean doesn't get all the things it needs, so have conducted a little investigation to find out.

Children have also been consolidating solving 'first, then, now' number problems, drawing on their fast recall of pairs of numbers that make a larger whole number. We have also managed to squeeze in a Rock Steady concert, Sports Day and a fantastic trip to Habberley trail- we have been so busy during our last summer in Reception class!



We have had a fantastic year this year and I am so proud of all their successes. They are a great team and have inspired each other, supported each other and have been such a pleasure to teach. Miss Collins will be over the moon to teach them next year! Keep reading and subitising with them over the summer so they can pick up from where they have left off and get off to a flying start – well done Reception class!

Our Learning in Year 1

This month we enjoyed our exciting trip to The Habberley Trail. I was so impressed with the way the children persevered with challenges and worked together as a team. We really had a fantastic time! In our writing lessons we have continued to be inspired by the book 'Grandad's Island' and we have planned our own amazing adventure stories! In maths we have learnt to tell the time and to recognise coins and notes. In history we have learnt all about why World War One began and the conditions in the trenches. We have looked at primary sources such as photographs, diaries and letters. In PE, we have enjoyed working with the cricket coach and the children did extremely well in their sports day!



I can hardly believe that we have come to the end of Year 1! The children have made such amazing progress in all their learning, and I am particularly proud of their achievements in phonics! I hope you all have a fantastic summer. Please do keep up the reading ready for Year 2!

Our Learning in Year 2

This month in Literacy, we completed our adventure narratives. We worked hard to include adjectives, precise verbs, and lots of feelings sentences. The children have also been working very hard on their handwriting. In Maths, the class used the four operations to solve everyday word problems. Our final Geography topic, focussing on our local area, has come to an end. We used maps to explore the school grounds and the surrounding areas. The children particularly enjoyed using Google Maps! Sports Day was a great success, and the children had lots of fun. Well done to all of them for taking part and being such good sports people.

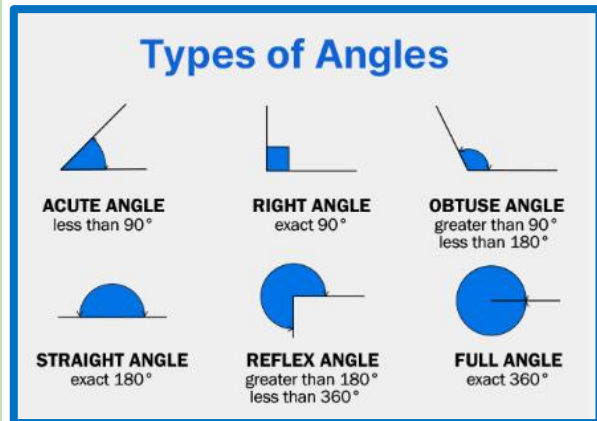


We will continue developing our handwriting to improve presentation, ready for Year 3. The children will be recapping their 2, 5, and 10 times tables and have been using them to solve further word problems in Maths. During their final week of Year 2, the children will enjoy some fun activities as we wish them a lovely summer break.

Our Learning in Year 3

This month we have been focusing on our new book 'The Secret of Black Rock' and have completed some research on some sea creatures we were interested in. In Maths, we have been looking at different types of angles, drawing 2D shapes and measuring and calculating perimeter. In Computing, we have been looking at different publishing software and the children have been using Canva to create their own magazine front cover based around a topic of interest.



All of the children have worked incredibly hard this year and have had some incredible experiences. They should all be very proud of everything they have achieved this year and I know that they will all continue to be stars in Year 4.

Our Learning in Year 4

This month, the Year 4's have worked extremely hard to organise a 'Wear Silly Clothes Day' in return for a donation to the food bank as part of their social action project. They have delivered a short assembly, wrote a letter that went out to parents and made posters to put around the school. They have done an amazing job and I am so proud of each and every one of them.

A big thank you to the rest of the school for embracing the day and for all of the generous donations. We have been blown away with the amount that has been donated.



We have come to the end of Year 4 and I am so proud of everything that they have achieved. It has been an absolute pleasure to be their teacher this year! I am sure they will continue to be amazing in Year 5!

Our Learning in Year 5

This month we have written our own poems based on 'The Highwayman' - we've loved being able to include a fight stanza! We have also finished our Year 5 maths curriculum with a unit learning about capacity and volume, including some very tricky word problems that have got our brains working! We've finished off units learning about the human life cycle in science and the savannah and desert biomes in geography. We also competed against our friends on sports day, enjoying cheering on our teams! We also enjoyed making and eating jollof rice in DT!



We have now reached the end of Year 5! It has been a busy year filled with lots of fantastic opportunities as well as learning. I am so proud of everything that the children have achieved this year and am sure they will be a great Year 6 next year!

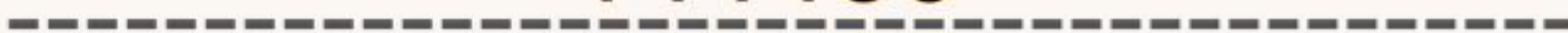

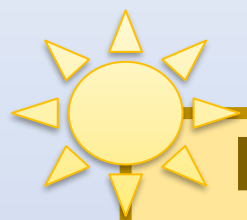

Wraparound Care Provisions

Wraparound care provisions is a fun, nurturing environment with a range of enrichment activities tailored to the needs of the children. The children have the choice of free play which builds lovely new friendships. We offer toys, games, technology, relaxation, reading, role-play, outside play (weather permitting) and lots of seasonal arts and craft activities for your young person to enjoy.



Breakfast Club

We open our doors at 7.40am and charge £4.30 per session. You can drop at any time between 7.40 and 8.30am. Children can have a healthy breakfast of cereal, toast, bagel, fresh fruit and squash, making them ready for the school day ahead. Cut off for booking sessions will be 12 midday the day before.



After School Club

We close our doors at 5.30pm and charge £4.60 if collected by 4.30pm or £8.20 if collected by 5.30pm. You can collect any time between 3.30pm and 5.30pm, by ringing the bell at the side entrance to the back playground or by calling our wraparound mobile phone number 07507565364. Light healthy snacks are also provided in after school club. Cut off for booking sessions will be 12 midday for after school club on the same day.

Booking and Cancelling Wraparound for All Children - Nursery to Year 6

All wraparound sessions are booked via Arbor, our parent portal (unless your child is of nursery age): <https://st-oswalds-primary-school.uk.arbor.sc/?/home-ui/index> – you will find wraparound services under clubs and payment is due at the time of booking also through Arbor. If for any reason you need to cancel the session, you can do this on Arbor by cancelling before the days cut off time of 12 midday for After School Club the same day and Breakfast Club for the following day. This will give you a full refund.

Universal Credit and Nursery Funded Hours

We are more than happy to supply a letter of evidence of your child's attendance at wraparound. Our schools URN number is 144456, should you need to provide this. We can also accept funded nursery hours as childcare providers, should you need a little extra time before or after nursery hours. Please contact us on office@stoswalds.worcs.sch.uk should you need assistance. For more information please take a look at the Government website to assist with funding childcare up to 11 years old: <https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare>

Late school pick up: If your child is still on school premises at 3.25pm, they will be taken across to after school club, where the usual After School Club charge will apply.

Late collection Fee: This is charged at £5.10 between 5.30pm and 5.45pm and an additional £5.10 for every 5 minutes after that. If you have booked for a 4.30pm collection and arrive after this time, you will be charged the 5.30pm cost (an additional £3.60).

Unattended booked sessions (eg due to illness) will still be charged unless 24 hours notice has been given of the cancellation. This should be done via the Arbor app.
