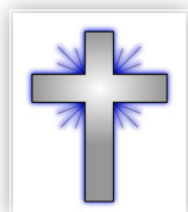
Another highlight of the term was the recent visit to London by some of our KS2 pupils. They had the extraordinary opportunity to tour the Houses of Parliament, gaining invaluable insights into the workings of our democracy. This experience undoubtedly enriched their understanding of civics and governance, bringing their classroom learning to life in a tangible way. Following the parliamentary tour, our pupils were treated to a performance of the acclaimed musical "Wicked" in London's West End. This captivating show not only provided entertainment but also offered a unique perspective on themes of friendship, acceptance, and the complexity of good and evil. I am certain that this theatrical experience will leave a lasting impression on our pupils, perhaps even inspiring some future thespians among them.

Your support in ensuring your child's daily attendance during this period is invaluable and greatly appreciated.

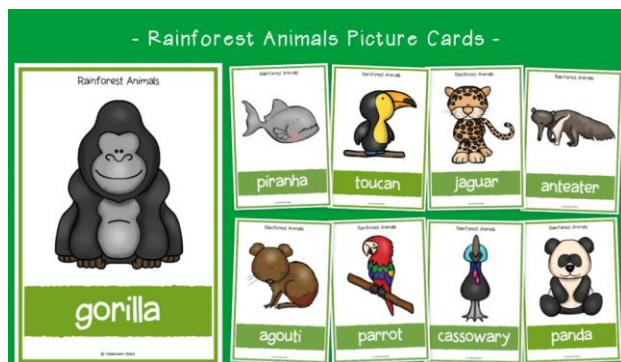

# Inspire Embrace Succeed

## Our Learning in Nursery

This month we have continued to learn about animals. We focused on animals that live in frozen climates and animals that live in jungles and rain forests. One of our rhymes of the week was 'down in the jungle'. The children really enjoyed picking a different jungle animal to sing about daily.

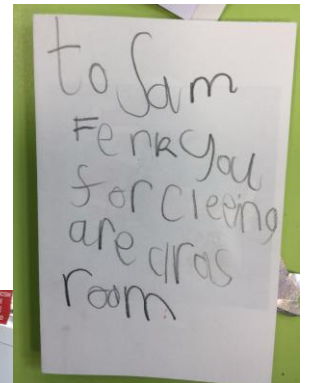
Before the Easter break we focused on the Easter story and why important in special to Christians. The children made Easter cards, made their own patterned Easter eggs and enjoyed an Easter egg hunt at Forest school listening to clues to find the hidden eggs.



Next month, our topic is 'I wonder where I have been'. We are focusing on the different places the children have visited or may visit. We have also planned activities for VE day, world Bee day and World Turtle day.

## Our Learning in Reception Class

This month we found out what was in our egg! Children were surprised to find a dragon had hatched – we discovered that she is actually a type of reptile and so has scales and lays eggs. Children have chosen the name Hilda for her. We have also completed our kindness acts for lent. Children have approached this task in earnest and have even been complimented for their kindness by other teachers and our cleaner. Everybody in the class wrote a card to show their appreciation of her hard work. She was very grateful. We have also learnt about how some numbers can be shown as a double and how odd numbers cannot be shown in this way.



Next month, we will be using memories to talk about the past during our new topic of 'I wonder what happened once upon a time?'. We will find out that things happened before they were born and some things were quite different! We will investigate 3d shapes and we will build on our understanding of the step pattern to secure a fluent recall of one more than, or one less than numbers in the number system.

## Our Learning in Year 1

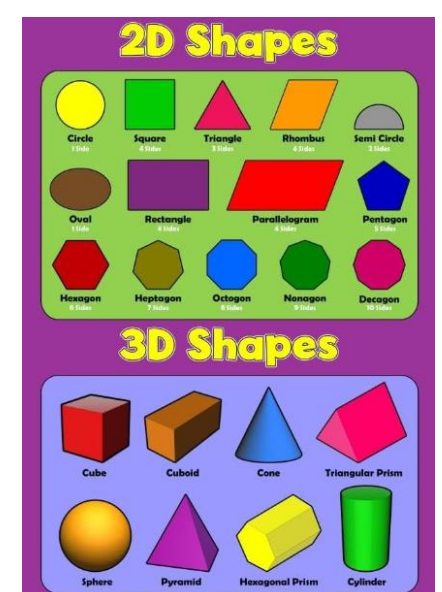
This month we have continued to learn all about plants, and we have explored the signs of spring and observed how the change of season has altered the world around us. We are studying one tree in particular, (see below) to monitor how it changes through the seasons. We have finished our study of the first moon landing and we have written some amazing stories about an alien landing on Earth! In our maths lessons we have focussed on solving word problems. We have enjoyed preparing for Easter and using split pins to make moveable Easter cards.



Next month, we will be learning all about London. We will name and locate the 4 countries that make up the UK and learn that London is the capital city. We will start to look at its physical and human features. Our lead text in English will be 'The Queen's Hat' by Steve Anthony. In science, we will begin to identify common materials and their properties.

## Our Learning in Year 2

This month we have continued learning about the United Kingdom. We explored the capital cities of the U.K and used Google Earth to look at key human and physical features. In maths, we finished our shape topic. We learnt about 2D and 3D shapes, all the children explored the school and classroom to find real life examples of these shapes, which they found fun! In literacy, we finished off our non-fiction writing. Children created their own information text on their favourite animals. They all became experts and added some interesting key facts about their chosen animal.

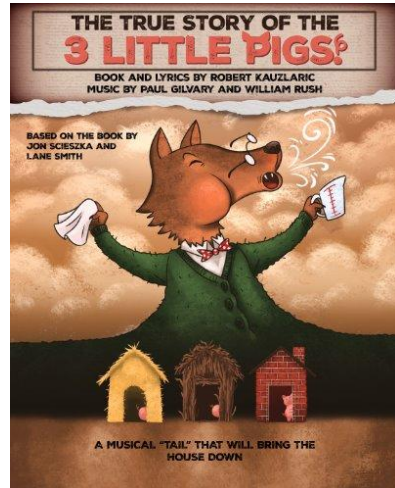
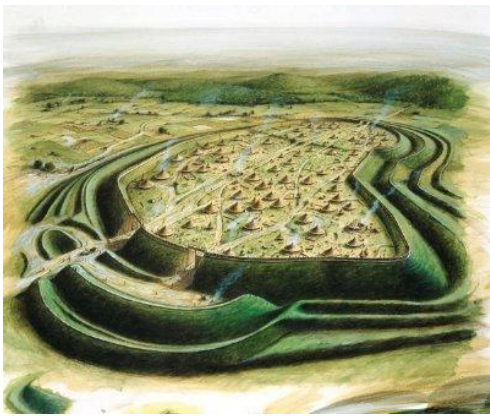


Next month, we will be learning about money in maths. We will be focussing on real life scenarios to help the children understand how it is used every day. In literacy, we will be writing a persuasive letter. The children will be learning different features and how to include them, along with some drama! In Geography we will be exploring the Arctic and Antarctica. Learning about the similarities and the differences, as well as learning about the explorers who have been to these places.

## Our Learning in Year 3

In English this month, we have been finishing writing our stories about the not-so-big, not-so-bad wolf from the story of the Three Little Pigs. We have transported the same wolf to the story of Little Red Riding Hood to write a humorous, twisted version of that story, where Red is the third pig in disguise attempting to take revenge on Wolfy. Maths has taken us on to money, where we have been adding amounts and finding change. In History, we have finished Iron Age (for now...) with an explanation about hill forts and why they were important to the Celts of Ancient Britain.

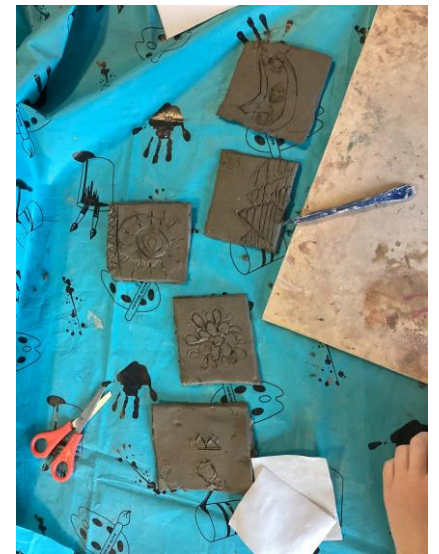


Though we are leaving History behind, we are organising a trip to see the remains of the Iron Age hill fort at Kinver Edge, so we will continue our look at Ancient Britain before Romans make an appearance after the summer half term. Geography will replace History, with a look at climate change. English will run in conjunction with this moving on to look at the book *The Street Beneath My Feet*, a non-fiction text about what our planet is made of. Ukulele will continue every Thursday, with Forest School starting after half term. PE will be every Friday after the Easter break.

## Our Learning in Year 4

This month we have been learning about fractions in maths and using the numicon to help us practically. In English we have been focusing on improving our work and really thinking about the vocabulary we use. We have been finishing looking at our geography unit on earthquakes and volcanoes and completed our Egyptian clay pots which the children LOVED!

I was so proud of Year 4 for their Easter service, thank you for all the adults that came to see them.



Next month, we will be learning about our local history, focussing on the carpet industry. We will be continuing with our fractions, moving on to look at equivalent fractions. We will be having the athletics coach on a Wednesday, and our other PE slot will be a Thursday.

## Our Learning in Year 5

During English this month, we have written the Easter story, focussing carefully on the Year 5 skills we can include. We have then edited and published our writing, which is the process that professional authors follow! We have also finished our Guided Reading text, *The Boy at the Back of the Class* – the narrator's name was finally revealed in the last chapter! In maths we have been learning how to translate and reflect shapes.

This half term we have had Forest School on a Thursday afternoon, where we have been working together as a team as well as enjoying lots of edible treats – thank you Mrs Noble!

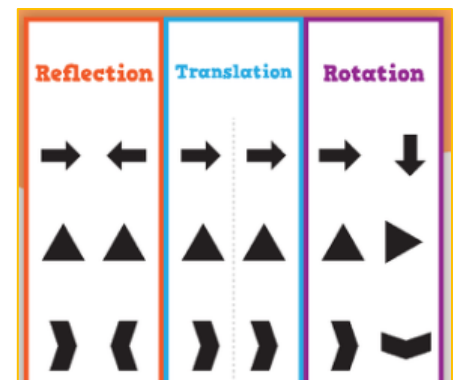
This month half of us visited the Houses of Parliament and watched *Wicked* in London, whilst the rest of us had a virtual tour at school – see later in the newsletter for more photos and our report!



Next month, we will be continuing our science unit about living things and their life cycles as well as our history topic on the Early Islamic Civilisation. In English we will be writing a speech as an astronaut who has been stranded on Mars and in Guided Reading we will be starting our new book, *Journey to the River Sea*.

## Our Learning in Year 6

This month, we have been using *Titanic* as a stimulus for our writing. We have written narratives based on the sinking of the *Titanic*, as well as formal letters of complaint. In maths, we have completed the curriculum by learning about position and movement, including translating and reflecting shapes. In science, we have completed our topic on light by carrying out investigations into refraction. In RE, we consolidated our learning about 'What does the resurrection mean to Christians?' by painting pebbles with symbols of the Easter story. In Guided Reading, we completed our text 'Dead Man's Cove' and wrote book reviews with our thoughts on the story.



Next month, we will be preparing for our SATs assessments (week commencing 12th May) by revising our maths, reading and grammar learning. We will start our new text in Guided Reading called 'The Eye of the Wolf' and use this as a stimulus for our writing. We will also begin our history topic all about the ancient civilisation of Benin. Once the SATs tests are over, Mrs Buckley will announce our end of year play, and we will begin rehearsing!

## What we did in LONDON!

We woke up at 6:00a.m and went into the hall, and got everything ready then we got on the coach at 6:45 and it took 4 hours. Finally we arrived in London at half ten. We saw Big Ben and the London Eye - it was amazing! Then we arrived at the House of Parliament and we went through metal detectors and put our bags on grey trays (it's kind of like an airport).

Then we did our tour at the House of Lords. There were speakers in the backs of the benches and some of them were covered with fabric and leather. Then in the same room we saw the kings/queens such as Queen Victoria and Henry the VIII and Queen Elizabeth's throne and the prince/princess chair. There were microphones in the air so they can do a speech or listen to what they are saying if they can't hear that well. Then we went to a hall where there was a man holding a golden mace. The Speaker of the Commons processed through the room because the House of Commons was about to start working for the day. When we went through the corridor to say ban chocolate and it was called the no consent and the consent aisle. There were bills and laws on tables, the bills are like ping pong passing from the House Of Lords to the House of Commons (no description because there was a speech happening). Then we went into a workshop to see our MP (Mark Garnier). We did Pictionary (it's where you have 4 sections a piece of card and one person draws and the others guess what they are drawing). We then played a bag game where you can feel, smell and try to guess what is inside and some of us took it in turns to open the bag to see what is inside. There were things in the bags that reminded us how a law is made. We were able to ask Mark Garnier some questions.

It felt amazing to look at everything, outside there are statues e.g. Winston Churchill and Big Ben and interesting artefacts to look at and examine it but we didn't have enough time to examine it all.

We went to eat our lunch on the grass next to the doors of Houses of Parliament. We had a little walk to the theatre, to watch Wicked.

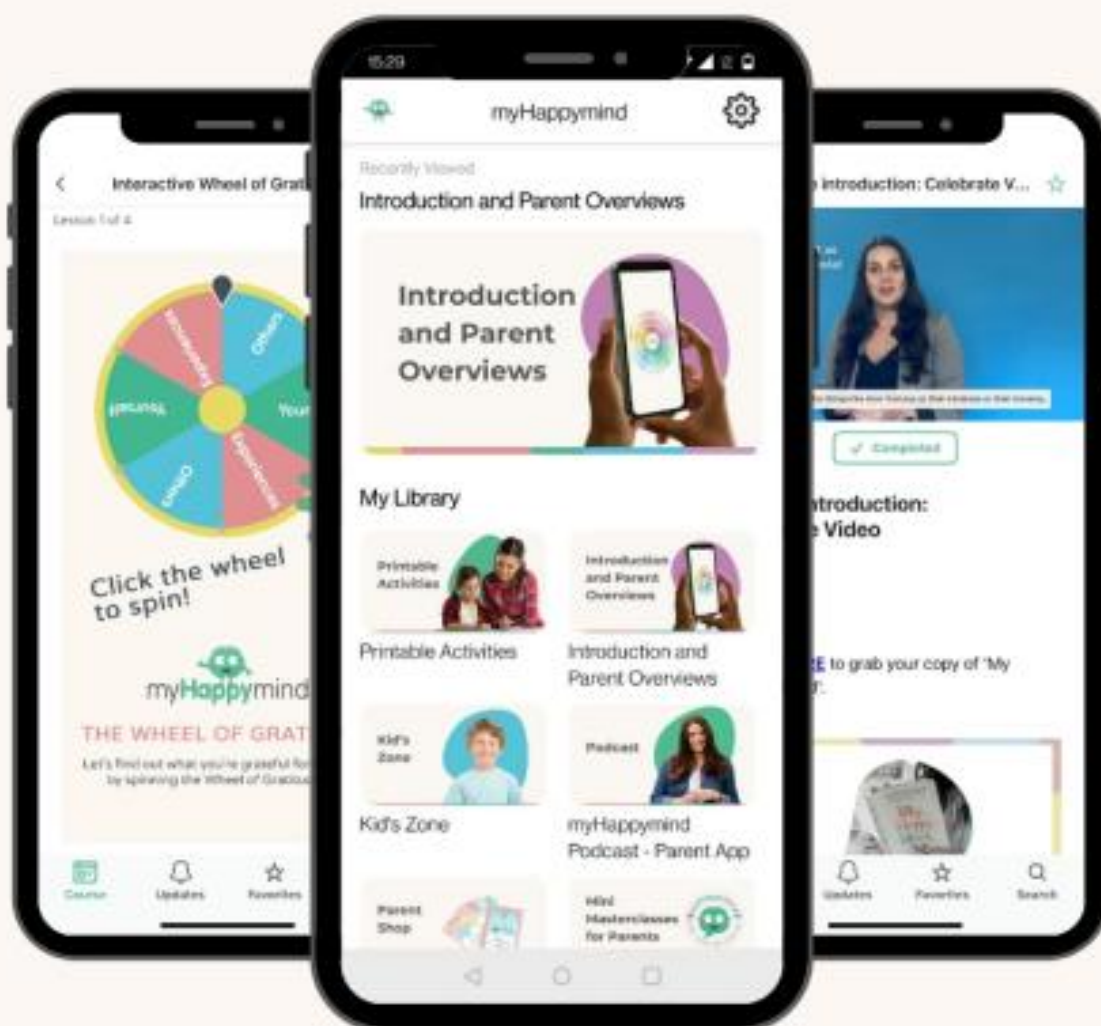

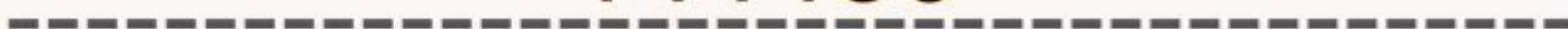
